

Cooking fats, oils and grease block pipes

Last year our teams removed 2,800 tons of leftover cooking fats and other unflushables from our region's sewers.

When poured down the sink leftover fat doesn't stay liquid for long, solidifying in the pipes which can cause blockages and sewer flooding. This is made worse when it mixes with wipes and other rubbish that belong in the bin.

And with lots of us cooking Christmas dinners this time of year, the amount of fat in the pipes increases.

Through our Just Bin It campaign we're encourage everyone to help prevent sewer flooding in homes and communities by only flushing the 3Ps: pee, poo and toilet paper—for everything else, just bin it.
